## Taubie and Ella's story


We want to share a story with you from our trip to the Holocaust Museum. We were looking at a model of a gas chamber at Auschwitz and the plaque describing it said - The four gas chambers and crematorium constructed at Auschwitz Birkenau represent Nazi mass murder in its most industrialized form. Each of the four facilities could kill an average of 1000 victims per day. About 1 million Jews and thousands of non-Jewish victims were killed in the gas chambers at Auschwitz Birkenau.

We were really drawn to this exhibit and towards the end we met an older lady. We had a meaningful conversation with her and she expressed how important it was to her that we were there. She told us how crucial it was for our generation to remember and we should encourage our peers to never forget. Not only did she almost break into tears while telling us this, she also did not know we were Jewish. Not that she needed to know this, but it just goes to show that you don't have to be Jewish to learn and remember the Holocaust.
